### *Pastor's Ponderings* *Pastor Scott Marsh*

*"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." John 15:1-5*

*"We've been cut by another 30%" This was troubling news to hear, but somewhat expected. On more than one occasion funding from the Michigan UMC conference offices had been cut and we had to figure out a way forward. Local churches just didn't seem to fully understand what ministry shares did, and as they would struggle to meet their individual church budget it was a soft spot to take dollars from. While I didn't know it then, a part of my calling was forming, testify to what ministry shares do and have done, because they nurtured me. I probably wouldn't be your pastor without ministry shares.*

*That conversation happened just under 10 years ago. I was involved with the Welsey Foundation at WMU and the head pastor Rev. Lisa Batten spoke to myself and the rest of the leadership of the college ministry informing us of what the budget cuts would look like for us. As local churches ceased paying their ministry shares it made our work as a campus ministry harder to do. We were growing, we were vibrant, yet because we were a ministry of poor college kids that would never be able to afford a full time pastor on our own we had to count on conference ministry shares to meet our budget.*

*Ministry shares are at times confusing. For one the name has changed over the years from apportionments to ministry shares. This payment to the conference seems a lot like paying money to big brother, and when your church is struggling a budget item without a face and with no voice seems like a good a place as any to cut from. But ministry shares cover a wide range of programs and serve a WIDE range of faces. I'll use my newsletter article to highlight, as best I can what your ministry share dollars fund.*

1. Approximately 75% of all ministry shares we send to the conference stays in Michigan, the other 25% goes to what is known as General Church Apportionments. This small 25% amount covers a number of international missions/causes: World Service Fund, Africa University Fund, Black College Fund, Interdenominational Cooperation Fund, Episcopal Fund, Ministerial Education Fund, and General Administration Fund. 2. That big 75% chunk of ministry share money is divided into 3 categories: Conference Benevolences(39%), Clergy Support(21%), and Administration (15%). More info on that [here](#) .

3. a. Conference Benevolences funds things like the Board of Young People's ministry (BYPM, which I serve as Vice chair of.) BYPM helps fund start up ministries specifically for young people, we fund the freedom school program , Ministry Incubators , Encounter MI call interns and so much more.

b. Conference Benevolences help fund our 8 campus ministries across the state. providing funding to pay for campus pastors, and programming. No campus ministry is funded 100% by ministry shares alone, many pursue giving from individual congregations, grants and other funding streams to support their ministries. They are diversified and creative, like the students who attend. Within my time involved with the just the WMU campus ministry 8 young people pursued a calling into ministry. Thats 8 young pastors, deacons, and church leaders. We need young leaders in our church don't we?

c. Conference Benevolences help fund our camps . Salaries for our District Superintendents, our Bishop, and conference staff. Resources pour out of these groups. One need only spend an afternoon looking at all the various resources you ministry shares provide to our Clergy and Church leaders.

Paying our ministry shares is a point of pride, its doing our part, and its support for those who have need. I am happy to have been apart of Church's that have always paid their ministry shares. Clearly their impact is great, stretching across the globe, yet we consistently find the fruit of this ministry if only we look. : )

## Nurse's Notes

At this writing I am nursing an outbreak of poison ivy. I guess that's what I get for not preparing for an impromptu weeding of a flower bed. Sure enough, 48 hours after I did this task, I acquired a rash in various areas of my body. Not a pleasant experience.

You can get poison ivy, poison sumac or poison oak in the same way. Contact to the poisonous plant or a pet who has been in a poisonous plant area can cause you to break out in a rash from the plant's oil, called urushiol. The rash may spread to other areas

of your body if you start scratching and you still have the dreaded oil on your hands. If your pet has been in an area of the poisonous plant wash him/her immediately while wearing rubber gloves. Pets usually don't get poison ivy, but they carry the urushiol oil on their coat. Consequently, when we pet them, we get infected. Blisters will develop in 1-14 days after your exposure to poison ivy and can last up to 14 days. It is recommended to avoid popping the blisters, but if they pop on their own the clear fluid will not spread the ivy but could cause an infection. Try not to scratch these open areas.

If exposed to the poisonous culprits, apply rubbing alcohol to your exposed body parts, gardening tools, or any other items, you were using. Scrub under your fingernails. Wash your hands with dishwashing soap in cool water. Wash your clothes after being outdoors. When gardening, try to wear long sleeves, pants, and gloves.

Over the counter medications such as anti-itch creams such as calamine lotion and hydrocortisone creams, antihistamines, oatmeal baths and cold compresses can help soothe the itching. If you become short of breath after inhaling the oil from a fire of the poisonous plants, emitting the oil, see your health care provider immediately. In my case my physician has ordered prednisone for 10 days per my request.

You may think the rash is spreading but it is not. The area in which you see the rash was exposed initially to the urushiol oil.

The poison ivy rash is not contagious. But you could get the rash if you touched the person that still has urushiol oil on them, clothing that has the oil on it or touch a contaminated garden tool or camping equipment.

The bottom line is "Leaves of three, let it be." Killing the culprit is very difficult because it doesn't neutralize the urushiol oil. It can stay contagious on dead plants for up to five years. With 90% of the population being allergic to these pesky plants we need to be more diligent in learning about these culprits. Believe me it is not fun.

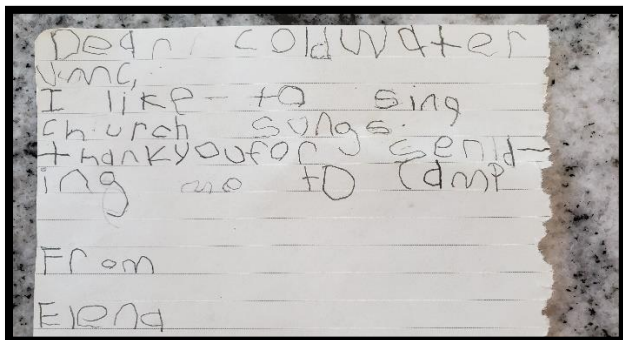
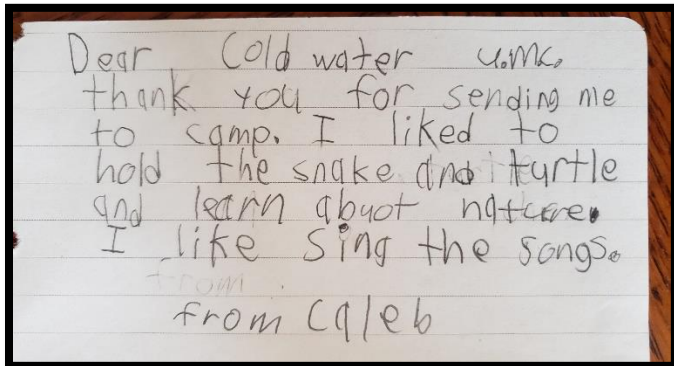
